WAX CRAYON RUBBING

What you need:

Wax Crayon/s, Paper





- Go outside and look for some fallen leaves.
 You want to find ones that are fresh, not dead leaves.
- 2. Place the first leaf on a table or other hard, smooth surface.
- 3. Place the paper over the top of the leaf.
- 4. Use the side of your crayon to rub over the area where the leaf is. The texture of the leaf should appear on the top of your paper.
- 5. Repeat with different leaves until you are happy with your picture.
- 6. You can try this out with other textures too.





- 1. Colour in the ornaments and decorate them with glitter glue or stickers.
- 2. Cut out the ornaments from the sheet.
- 3. Get an adult to help you make a hole in the top for the ribbon to go through.
- 4. Thread the ribbon through the hole and tie the two ends together.
- 5. Find a place to hang up your ornament, they are perfect for a Christmas tree.

- 3. If you're doing it with someone else, try and be the first to see each bird.






SNOWFLAKE CRAFT

What you need:

Square, white paper • Scissors • Decorations













What to do:

- 1. Fold a piece of blank, square paper as shown.
- 2. Make small cuts in the side of the folded triangle, making sure not to cut right through.
- 3. Open up to reveal your snowflake. Just like a real snowflake it will be symmetrical.
- 4. If you like, add decorations to make it sparkle even more.

SNOW GLOBE

This craft is a very festive snow globe. You can make it and keep it for yourself, but it would also make a good present for someone else.



Jar **Objects** (e.g. plastic figures or a toy Christmas tree) Glue and Glitter



















- 1. Open the jar and use the glue to firmly stick the bottom of the object/s to the lid. Wait for the glue to completely dry.
- 2. Fill the jar with water (not quite full) and add the glitter.
- 3. Put glue around the inside edge of the jar, so once it's closed you can't open it again.
- 4. Screw on the lid tightly with the ornament attached.
- Shake it and you have a snow globe!






PHOTO CHALLENGE

Beginner Level


- Something in nature, for example a plant, tree or flower.

- An object from a different generation (something old-fashioned).



What you need:

Card • Glue Stick
