National and local status

Newham London

The number of infections continues to grow, as of **4pm on 20 April 2020**:

- 124,743 cases of coronavirus have been confirmed.
- There have been **16,509 deaths** in the UK.
- Newham has 862 confirmed cases.
- We have had to reduce many council services to support social distancing or due to lack of staff.



Key messages for staff 21/04/2020



- The first #AskAlthea online session was attended by 160 members of staff asking a variety of questions on topics including PPE, how to volunteer and where staff can go for help and support.
- If you need advice or support, please ask for help at any time. 
