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National and local status

Newham London

The number of infections continues to grow, as of **5.04pm on 6 May 2020**:

- **201,101 cases** of coronavirus have been confirmed.
- There have been **30,076 deaths** in the UK.
- Newham has 964 confirmed cases.
- We have had to reduce many council services to support social distancing or due to lack of staff.

Testing update

- Testing is available to key workers and their household members who may be self-isolating due to symptoms. The full list of essential workers can be found: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested#essential-workers
- The **test must be taken within the first 5 days of symptoms**, therefore is unsuitable for ٠ people who have self-isolated longer than 5 days.
- The turnaround between test and result is **48-72 hours**. ٠
- Access a test at home: book an online test: https://self-referral.test-for-٠ <u>coronavirus.service.gov.uk/</u> (select home test)
- Access a fixed site:
- There are currently 2 sites near East London ٠
 - O2 Arena, Edmund Halley Way, Greenwich, SE10 0PH
 - Lee Valley Athletics Centre, N9 OAR
- The sites are open between 10am and 5pm. ٠
- You can book through the self-service portal : https://self-referral.test-for-٠ <u>coronavirus.service.gov.uk/</u> selecting the test site which works best for you.
- Newham Council and care workers can also book a priority test through the CCG by sending an email with the person's name and mobile number to thccg.cv19@nhs.net before 12pm.
- People who attend the **testing sites without an appointment will not be tested.**

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Spotlight on trading standards

Newham London



- Newham Trading Standards officers this week mounted a concerted operation in some of our busiest high streets to ensure trading compliance during Covid-19.
- The team visited at least 30 businesses trading on High Street North in East Ham, and the Upton Lane area of Forest Gate, taking action against those trading unlawfully or who were failing to properly enforce social distancing.
- **16 shops were given verbal advice, complied, immediately closed** and know that they'll be checked again;
- 5 shops were given advice about how to effectively manage social distancing during their trading hours;
- **2 closure notices were served**, when verbal advice to close was not followed;
- 2 Fixed Penalty Notices (or fines) were served for breach of a closure notice that had been served previously.

- Thanks to the transport service team, including their manager John Wood and all the drivers who have continued to drop children to school but have also been supporting the #HelpNewham Hubs. Last week alone they were vital and helped deliver around 4,000 parcels.
- Our concierge officers in the Housing team have also gone above and beyond to keep residents safe. The team, led by Vlademir Pinto, have been providing an excellent service to the residents of around 1,700 flats in 29 tower blocks. They have increased the number of staff to carrying out health and safety inspections, removing clutter, reporting communal repairs and ASB as well as checking in on vulnerable residents.



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
