




Message from the Chief Executive Althea Loderick

Coronavirus (Covid-19) Keeping you in touch



- This is a slide-based briefing which should be cascaded to all staff through line management chains and shared / <u>discussed with all those who are not</u> <u>on email at weekly or daily briefings</u>. It is issued to Managers at least 2x per week on Tuesday and Thursday, or more frequently as required.

National and local status



The number of infections continues to grow, as of 4.11pm on 27 May 2020:

- 267,240 cases of coronavirus have been confirmed.
- There have been 37,460 deaths in the UK.
- Newham has 999 confirmed cases.
- We have had to reduce many council services to support social distancing or due to lack of staff.



Key updates for staff 28/05/2020



- We are making preparations for a very limited return to office for some staff from next week.
- Our overriding priority is the health, safety and wellbeing of our employees.
- Line managers of those currently working at home will have spoken with their teams about who
 may need or wish to return to the workplace and provided a data capture form that provides us
 with the outcome of these conversations.
- Return to work arrangements should fit your personal circumstances. If you are currently working
 from home, and if your line manager hasn't discussed this data capture with you, then feel free
 to give them a nudge. Line managers should be capturing this information with you, not for you.
- We are **developing short videos** and information for staff to explain how our buildings and offices will work with social distancing rules in place. And those that we agree will come back in to the office will all be given a comprehensive induction into the new ways of working.
- For those of you **that will be asked to continue to work from home**, we are reviewing how we can continue to support you.
- Staff are reminded that if you need advice or support, please ask for help at any time. Key updates for staff 28/05/2020

- Newham London
- As part of the preparation to return to work, we are making adaptations to our offices so that the risk of contracting Covid-19 in the workplace is minimised. This includes:
- Reviewing the capacity of buildings and completing risk assessments of offices and work spaces so
 we can maintain social distancing rules. Because of their design, some offices may not reopen in
 the short term, and capacity at all of the offices that do open will be significantly reduced.
- New signage in buildings and many desks and areas of buildings will be closed off. There will be
 floor markings to help guide people through particular one-way circulation routes. Only one person
 will be allowed in a lift at any one time, and in certain buildings will be asking all staff that are able to
 walk down the stairs. Entry and exit protocols to certain buildings are being implemented along
 with new cleaning regimes and improved access to sanitisers and wipes.
- New procedures to **keep visitors to buildings and the staff they meet safe**. Adaptations are being made to reception areas, including the **installation of screens and controlled queueing systems**.
- To enable effective workspace cleaning, we also need to adopt a 'clear desk' policy.
- Reviewing our HR advice, for example on **flexible working**, and also our advice to those that are **shielding** and those that are still required to **support children at home**.
- Developing a 'workforce travel plan' that will provide advice, support and practical help on travel to work. We are also sourcing face coverings for those required to use public transport.

- Newham London
- As schools prepare to reopen, we are moving our #HelpNewham
 operations out of eight hubs and into two new superhubs one in
 Stratford Old Town Hall and one in St Mark's industrial estate near City
 Airport. If anyone can help over the next two weeks with moving over

- With some people returning to on site working, and advice to avoid public transport if possible, now is a great time to consider cycling to work. The Cycle to Work scheme enables you to save money on a new bike and accessories whilst spreading the cost over 12 months.
- The scheme is open to permanent employees and employees on a fixed term contract with at least 12 months remaining. For more information www.cyclescheme.co.uk.
- Staff are able to access a ½ day online Mental Health Awareness training delivered via Zoom.
- The 4hr introductory course is designed to increase mental health awareness, provide an understanding of how to look after wellbeing and challenge stigma towards mental health. Testing update

- Testing for Covid-19 is available in Newham, with fixed and mobile site options for booking.
- The test must be taken within the first 5 days of symptoms, therefore is unsuitable for people who have self-isolated longer than 5 days.

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- The turnaround between test and result is **48-72 hours**.
- Access a test at home: book an online test: https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/ (select home test)
- Access a fixed site:
- There are currently 2 sites near East London
 - O2 Arena, Edmund Halley Way, Greenwich, SE10 0PH
 - Lee Valley Athletics Centre, N9 0AR
- The sites are open between 10am and 5pm.
- Mobile testing sites: due to operate at Big Motoring World next Monday June 1 and Tuesday June 2. Bookings are essential.
- You can book through the self-service portal : https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/ selecting the test site which works best for you.
- Newham Council and care workers can also book a priority test through the CCG by sending an email with the person's name and mobile number to thccg.cv19@nhs.net
- People who attend the testing sites without an appointment will not be tested.
- Newham Council is also taking a lead role in the test, track and trace programme. Find out more: www.newham.gov.uk/staffinfo
