# Coronavirus (Covid-19) Keeping you in touch

#### **National and local status**

Newham London

The number of infections continues to grow, as of 4.01pm on 01 July 2020:

- **313,483 cases** of coronavirus have been confirmed.
- There have been **43,906 deaths** in the UK.
- Newham has 1,017 confirmed cases.
- We have had to reduce some council services to support social distancing or due to lack of staff.



#### Return to work update: 02/07/2020

 While the Government has announced some easing of lock down arrangements, as far as working at Newham remains the same:

1. If **an employee is able to effectively undertake their job role at home**, then in line with government guidance, they will not be asked to attend the workplace.

2. If a manager needs to ask an employee to attend the workplace, that workplace will be "Covid-19 secure" & all required health & safety measures, including risk assessments & training, will be in place.

- We are putting our employees' Health and Safety first and that means where 2m social distancing is in place it is maintained.
- We are not going to allow more desks to come into operation, or to ask staff to work closer together.
- In some very specific circumstances (e.g. where more than one staff member travels in a car together for work) the 2m social distancing measure is not practical. Where this is the case, service managers will be reviewing operating procedures and ensuring that appropriate mitigating measures (screens, seating arrangements, protective equipment where necessary) are in place.

# Staff update: 02/07/2020

- The #AskAlthea Zoom session on 18 June had a varied series of questions from staff.
- Staff asked whether testing might be used more or even required by the council - we don't currently have any ability to instigate large scale testing for our workforce independently. We're not doing temperature checks or other tests because we're following the guidance and the emphasis in all countries is still on observing appropriate spacing, washing hands and all the things that protect others and ourselves.
- Staff also asked about the need for internal restructures at this time. We can't and shouldn't stop everything. What we can do is be compassionate, reasonable and transparent about what we're doing and why we are doing it. Any restructure should set out the rationale for the proposed actions. If it doesn't stack up then we shouldn't do it.
- Other topics included the use of bicycles in the borough, the benefit of encouraging Newham's young people and the effect of Covid 19 on their education, working from home on an ongoing basis, and the impact of furloughing and possible redundancies on our residents.
