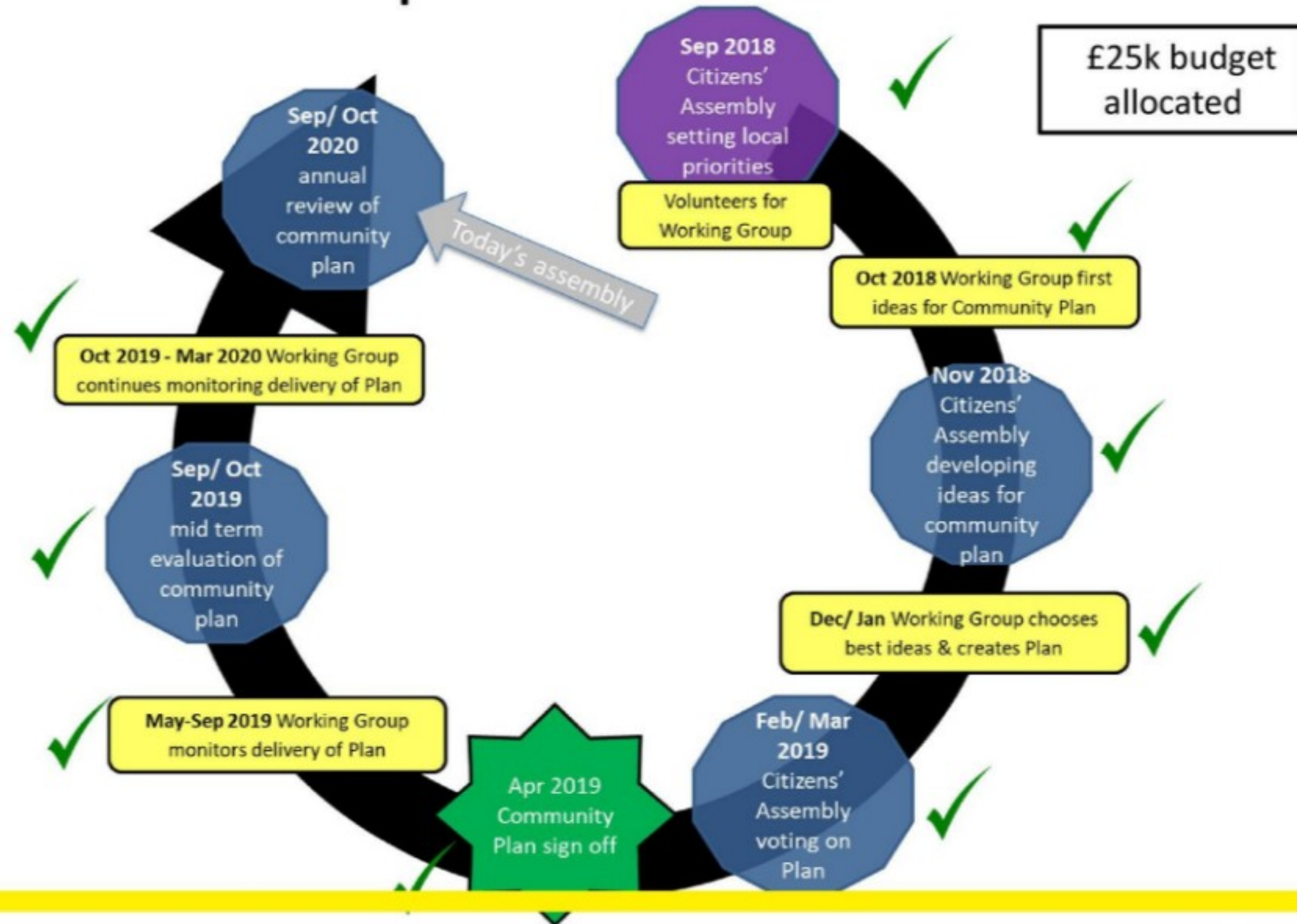

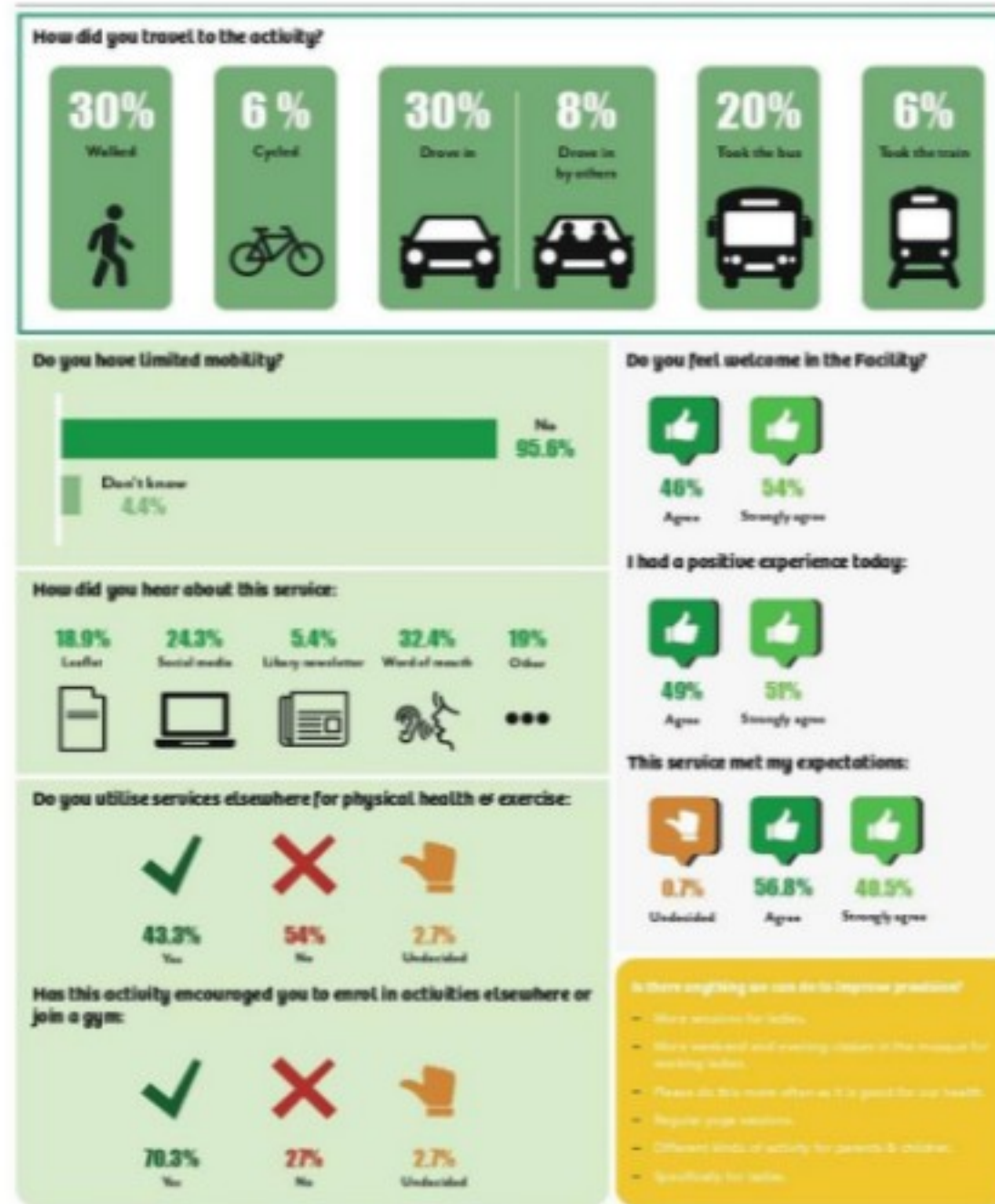

The projects need to keep going. We need and want a clean area and a reduction in petty crime on green street (flower sellers, cash machine scammers etc).

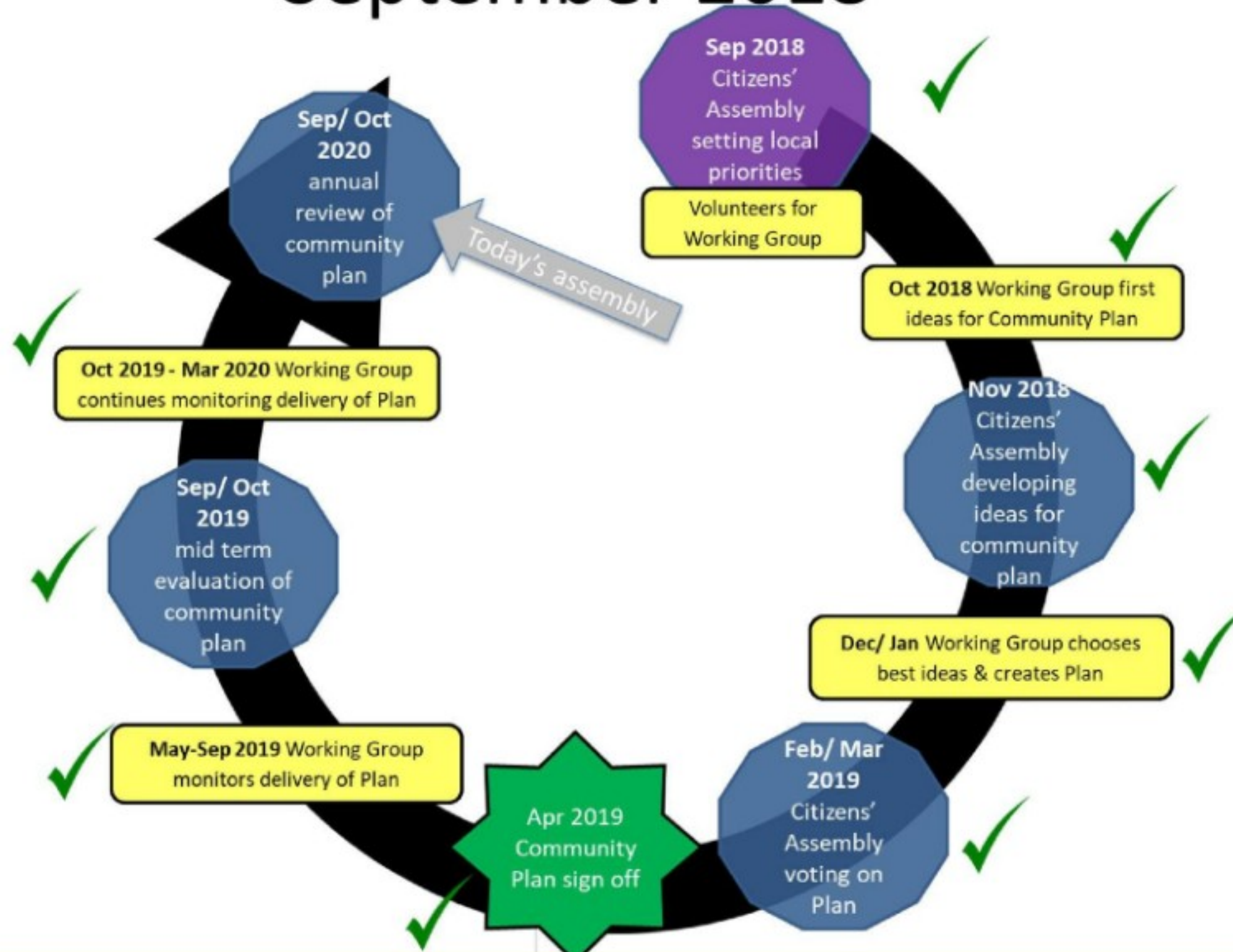

# What feedback do you have on this whole cycle of assemblies & how do you think we can design & improve future assemblies?

Residents should better of Citizen assemblies - and day to day life to assist each other

Require more time for big projects

Crime community safety - more work in this area - to create more cooperative neighbours

Is there a gap in the information

A better understanding of what is happening - we can keep in touch - more cooperation between neighbours - on the streets should be encouraged

If priorities and budgets can be done quite quickly, then the overall time can be reduced

Residents should take advantage of the education projects and progress from these

18 months is a good duration for assemblies

The team has done well to achieve all this in such a short time

# What feedback do you have on this whole cycle of assemblies & how do you think we can design & improve future assemblies?

The outcome is good and there are clear benefits

Happy with the progress and would like to see it continue

Improve communication - how do residents know

When was the budget set? when were residents informed of the £25K spend

We understand the work of community neighbourhood but a lot of other services do not understand us the same way. This can be quite confusing.

Bring all faith organisations into the projects for continued dialogue

# What feedback do you have on this whole cycle of assemblies & how do you think we can design & improve future assemblies?

Suggest more of a vetting process for working group as many dropped off. They should understand the commitment needed and what the expectations and roles are

Benefits for the community should be made clearer. We have under sold ourselves. So much achieved and so much effort needs to be understood.

Assemblies have been really effective at engaging the community, though we need to build on the good work done. Build on it!!

Rather than a 1 off knife crime event, have a follow up so as to ensure understanding, but generally very happy with projects

Young people need a place to go. This has a huge impact on crime (if youth centres etc are not provided)

Could we do assemblies from third party venues

Ongoing reports about what has happened / been achieved would be beneficial.

We need more funding

Youth involvement important
