




Cases (Positive tests) This week 586 Last week* 488 4,239 Total cases to date







WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The picture for Newham is still concerning. Cases are still increasing week on week. Over the past week there have been 586 new cases across the borough. The proportion of those getting tested who get a positive result is also increasing day by day. This means there is active transmission in our community with multiple sites of transmission, so the risk of catching Covid-19 is higher for everyone in Newham every day.

Even though London has moved to high risk in the national local alert levels. The impact of this depends on everyone following all the guidance and restrictions all the time. So we strongly urge people to follow the rules and public health advice wherever you are to reduce the risk of infection spreading.

Please stay home and avoid meeting with or close contact with others if you have Covid-19 or symptoms; cover your face in public, wash your hands regularly, do not mix with other households indoors, and please observe the rule of six outdoors.
