






Vaccination coverage up to 11th April

108,070 first dose given (29% of population). Of these:

- Cohort 1: 239 to older residents in care (92%)
- Cohort 2: 5,054 to 80+ (91.5%)
- Cohort 3: 8,635 to 75+ years (81%)
- Cohort 4: 14,357 to 70+ (81%) 25,484 to CEV (77%)
- 93,568 to under 70 years
- 4.918 to frontline health and social care workforce

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new Covid-19 cases has remained static this week. Testing has fallen slightly while positivity has increased very slightly. 108,070 first dose and 15.699 second dose vaccines have been given (up to 11 April).

It's vital that everyone currently eligible gets a vaccine when offered; getting vaccinated protects the whole community and not just yourself.
