


## Vaccination coverage (to 23rd Feb 2022)

1<sup>st</sup> doses: 242,994 (68% of population) 2<sup>nd</sup> doses: 216,832 (62% of population) 3rd doses / boosters: 126,180 (36% of pop.)

ONS population estimates:

1<sup>st</sup> dose: 83% 2<sup>nd</sup> dose: 75%

3<sup>rd</sup> dose/booster: 43%

# WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases fell this week with 1,022 cases. Testing also decreased.

242,994 first doses, 216,832 second doses, and 126,180 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 23rd Feb).

Case rates are falling in Newham and nationally but please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
