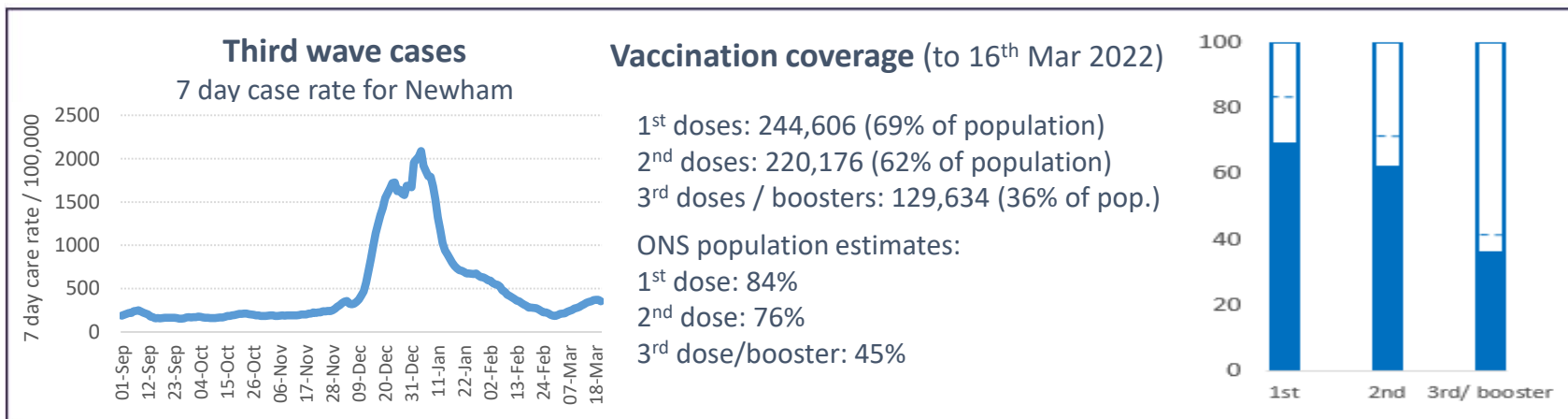

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases increased this week with 1,357 cases while testing remained the same.

244,606 first doses, 220,176 second doses, and 129,634 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 23rd Mar).

Case rates are rising in Newham again. Please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
