


#### Vaccination coverage (to 16<sup>th</sup> Mar 2022)

1<sup>st</sup> doses: 244,606 (69% of population) 2<sup>nd</sup> doses: 220,176 (62% of population) 3<sup>rd</sup> doses / boosters: 129,634 (36% of pop.)

ONS population estimates:

1st dose: 84% 2<sup>nd</sup> dose: 76%

3<sup>rd</sup> dose/booster: 45%

# WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases increased this week with 1,357 cases while testing remained the same.

244,606 first doses, 220,176 second doses, and 129.634 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 23rd Mar).

Case rates are rising in Newham again. Please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
