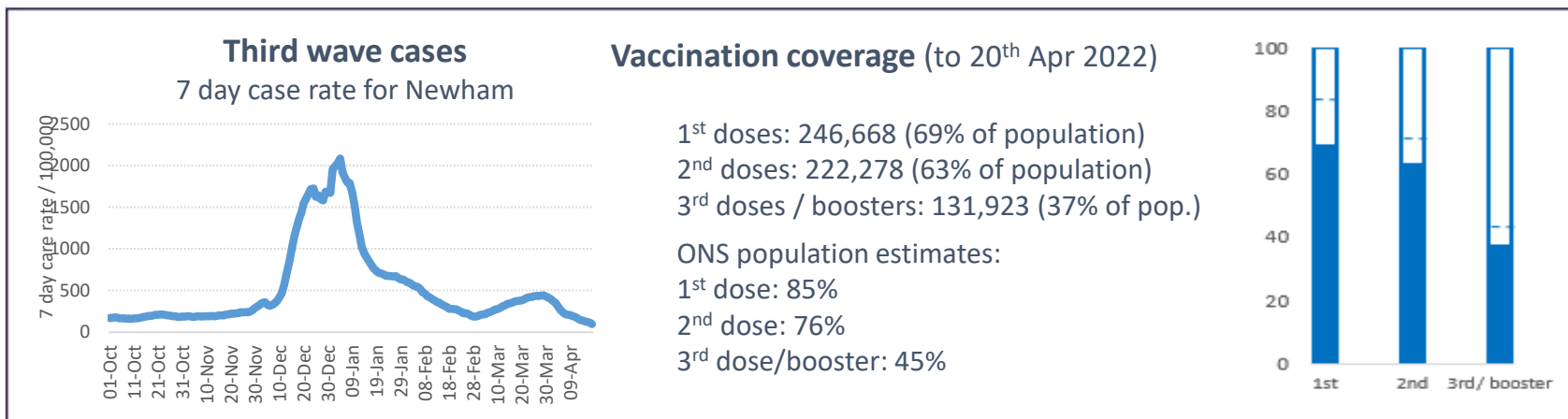

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases decreased this week with 433 cases. Testing also decreased.

246,668 first doses, 222,278 second doses, and 131,923 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 20th Apr).

Case rates remain high in Newham and nationally. Please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
