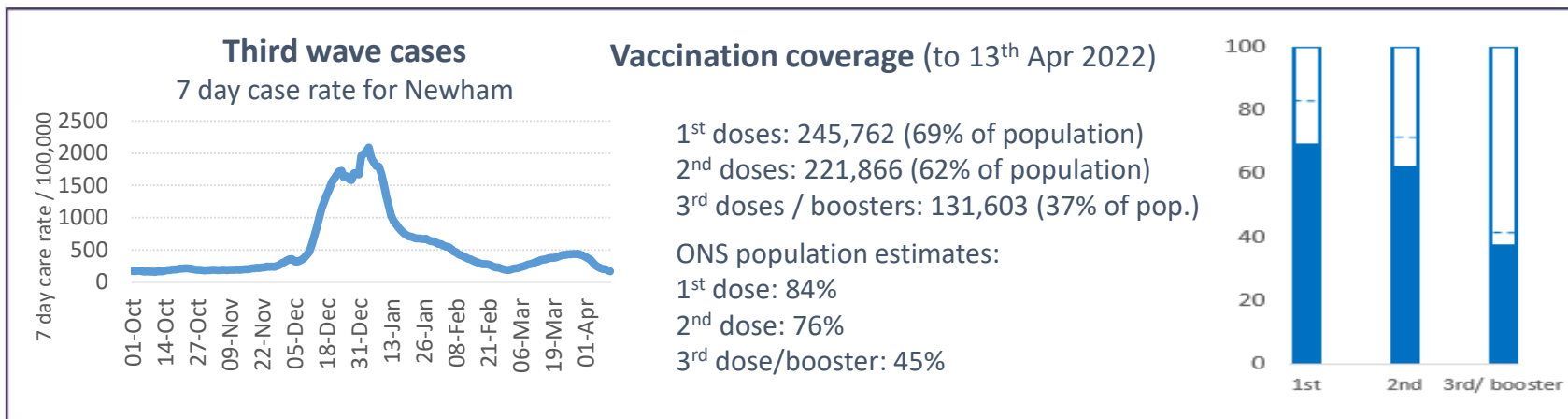

## WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The number of new COVID-19 cases decreased this week with 728 cases. Testing also decreased.

245,762 first doses, 221,866 second doses, and 131,603 third dose/booster vaccines have now been given (up to 13<sup>th</sup> Apr).

Case rates remain high in Newham and nationally. Please continue to get tested and get the vaccine when offered.
