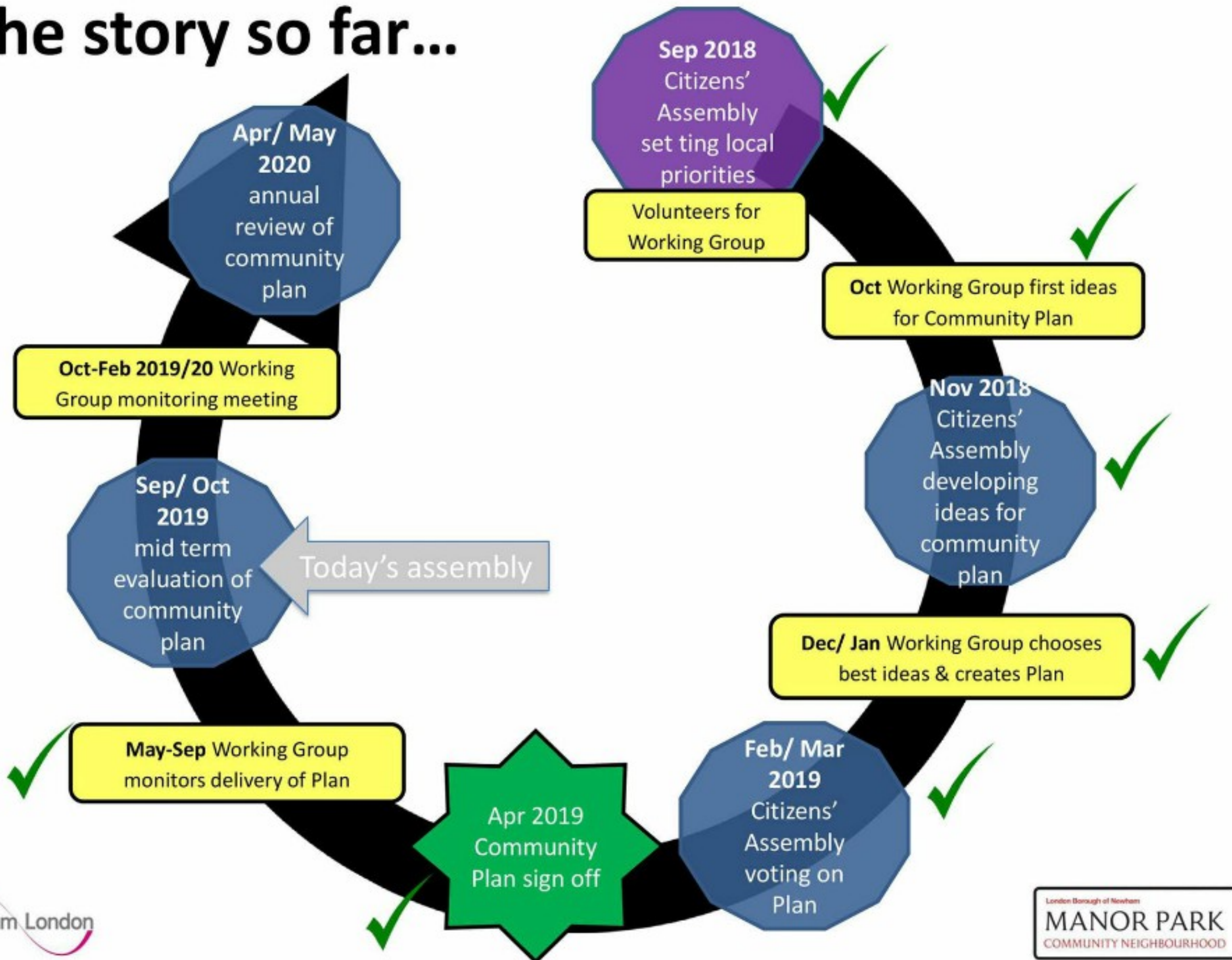

Smarter Streets Project £2,000

- The 'Smarter Streets' project aims to develop local civic pride
- Encourage resident engagement through clean up days
- Identify grot spots areas across neighbourhood that require intensive improvement
- Promote key messages around recycling, street parties and the councils approach to air quality

- Great British Clean up day events in Manor Park held in April-May 2019 – Participants **125** School Children, local Residents and Volunteers
- Community Payback all year round, payback team have been working on grot spot areas across the Manor Park, Eastham North Little Ilford neighbourhood and Plashet Park
- We will set up **3** resident led clean up days Feb – March 2020

Priority 1: Litter, Fly-tipping and a Cleaner Environment

Bling My Street - £3000 – will be delivered by provider Salmagundi

- ‘Bling My Street’ aims to bring residents together to encourage ownership and pride where they live.
- We will work with relevant council departments to identify an area to beautify the location and make a difference to the neighbourhood

- Salmagundi have held a recce and they have looked at the worst fly tipped and littered areas in the neighbourhood
- Also looking at unloved areas that could be transformed
- Salmagundi will apply for City Airport funding for another **3K**
- Salmagundi have identified a few locations which look promising the aim is to deliver this project by March 2019.
- We will support a final celebratory event to encourage residents to get to know their neighbours.

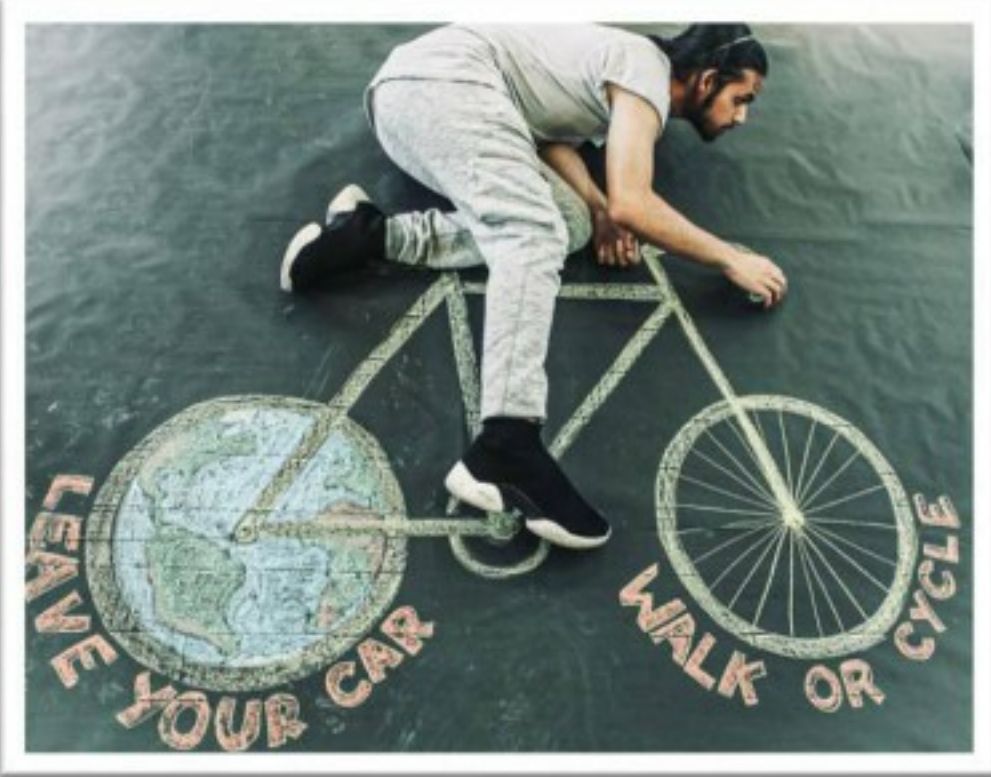


Priority 1 and 2: Litter, Fly-tipping and a Cleaner Environment & Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

Community Neighbourhood Roadshows - £3,000

- Community Neighbourhood Roadshows will provide an opportunity for residents to get information on the community neighbourhood offer.
- Advice and guidance on how to access online services and activities to engage children.
- We will support ways to report, fly-tipping, anti-social behaviour and provide information on Recycling.
- Residents will be meeting the Enforcement and SNT teams.
- Events will be held in high footfall locations, the hope is to engage and support **3000** residents from the Community Neighbourhood.

- **Road show 1** - held at Summer Festival 17th August 12-4pm – the event attracted **3000** people –held in Manor Park ward
- **Road Show 2** - held on the 22nd Sept – National Car Free Day – held in Little Ilford ward – **100** families engaged
- **Road show 3** – Date TBC March 2020 – East Ham North ward

Priority 1: Litter, Fly-tipping and a Cleaner Environment

Bins and Seats - £6,000

- Based on intelligence from the Citizen Assembly, many residents have raised concerns about stickers, signage, and state of the street furniture.
- This pilot project aims to make a difference to the Street Furnisher and create a artistic feature from the dilapidated street furnisher on one designated section of Romford Road.
- We will involve residents, businesses through the business forum, volunteers, and key stakeholders



Priority 3: Community and Culture

Ideas Days - £1,500

- Provide information on cultural opportunities, grants, holding local events or community projects.
- Promote local cultural skills, venues, and funding opportunities
- Display local artists and their creative work
