Working with Cody Docks

The Gasworks Dock Partnership was formed as a social enterprise in November 2009 and registered as a charity in April, 2011.

With Phase One complete and the Leaway River Lea Park now kick started, Cody Dock is already home to a number of creative industries, social enterprises and visitor attractions, that include:

- Docklands Community Boat
- Cody Dock Cafe
- Gallery and exhibition space
- Outdoor classroom
- Studio spaces



In 2018, Cody Docks successfully gain planning permission for a 7 year development plan, which will include:



- Exhibition space
- Social and Industrial heritage archive and pavilion
- International artist and respite hosting suites
- 10 new studios and workshop spaces
- 10 new live/work moorings
- Visitor moorings
- Dry dock facilities

Social Housing & Private Rented Sector Housing Sessions

Beginning the next phase of your life in the UK might seem daunting, Welcome Newham host Housing sessions every month. They are based in **Stratford Library**, **3 The Grove**, **London**, **E15 1EL from 3:30pm till 5:00pm**.

At the workshop, you will meet with The PRS Team (Private Rented Sector Team) and the Homefinder organisation who are committed:

- To advise and assist you on the challenges you may face when you transition to living in the private rented sector (PRS).
- How Newham Council is able to support you when the time comes to move to the private rented sector / social housing.
- To provide guidance that can help you navigate the private housing sector maximising the likelihood of success.

In addition, we have stories for successful residents who have secured a PRS / Social Housing accommodation in and around the borough, so you can ask them questions about their experience and get useful information from them which can help you on your journey.

Welcome Newham partnership with Small Grants Organisations

Organisations	Summary of Projects
Alternatives Trust	Courses in our Centre's 'Learning Hub' – a boardroom with a screen and donated laptops to fill basic skills gaps that prevent women from finding work or studying in the UK. They aim to help women be ready to find work when they have the immigration status that allows them to do so.
Bonny Downs Community Association	Family Hub project welcomes all refugee/ migrants/asylum seekers parents in Newham with dependent children who are struggling to raise family on their families on very low incomes and/or without the support network of extended family nearby. The free weekly drop-in group offers food, peer support, donated second hand clothing, parent-led cooking workshops, toys for the children to play with, and trained advocates who can help with immigration/housing/domestic abuse/school registrations
Eastside Community Heritage	This project aims to enable refugees to explore places in Newham and find out about their cultural, community and heritage associations.
Inspire Women, Men and Children	Help people prepare for life in Newham through social activities, training and volunteering opportunities.
Newham Community Project	Employability, healthy eating clubs, workshops on health, outreach and resettlement support
RDLAC	RDLAC Champion will provide support to the community making them aware of RDLAC projects including walk groups, art groups, mental health support groups, youth groups, gardening groups, cooking tutorials and hot meals, and friendships groups. In addition, there will be 10 funded places each month for individuals / families to join RDLAC monthly coach trips and community events.
Rosetta Arts	Work jointly on creative activities aimed at developing skills in textile-making and social entrepreneurship.

Organisations	Summary of Projects
Skills Enterprise	Provide monthly and weekly activities that will support refugees and people seeking asylum in building social connections, raising their awareness and knowledge about UK systems and accessing appropriate support.
The new Black Film Collective	Over the course of the project, we will hold nine events for groups moving into Newham: three for people of African heritage, three for people of Asian heritage and three for people of Eastern European heritage. Each of these events will be held at mostly Stratford East Picturehouse and will include a free screening, a culturally-specific performance, talks from members of the community and a series of stalls for businesses and services, which aim to support migrants settling in Newham.
