<p>12</p>	<p><u>UK Government advances mental health reform to better support autistic people</u></p>
	<p>The UK Government is set to 'end the inappropriate detention of autistic people and people with learning disabilities' under the new Mental Health Act reform. This was announced just this morning and will have a positive impact on the lives of many autistic people.</p> <p>The three key points from the Mental Health Bill are:</p> <p>A modernised Mental Health Act to improve patient support, humane treatment, and reduce disparities. Introducing care plans, prohibiting police/prison cells in mental health crises, and stopping inappropriate detention of autistic people and those with learning disabilities. Increased involvement of patients, families, and carers enhances treatment and protects patients, staff, and the public</p> <p>The impact of inpatient mental health units</p> <p>The noise and chaos of inpatient mental health units can cause more distress, and with a lack of understanding and personalised care, autistic patients don't get better. They become trapped for years on end. And if they leave, they aren't properly supported in the community, so too often they return. <p>13</p>	<p><u>Budget 2024 and what this means for Adult Social Care</u></p>
	<p>An £86 million increase will also be applied to the Disabled Facilities Grant. This will have the potential to support around an additional 7,800 adaptations to homes for those with social care needs. Thus, preventing hospitalisations and ensuring people can live independently.</p> <p>To support our unpaid family carers, from April 2025 the government will increase the Carer's Allowance weekly earnings limit from £151 a week to £196 - the equivalent of 16 hours at the National Living Wage.</p> <p><u>Chancellor chooses a Budget to rebuild Britain - GOV.UK</u></p>
