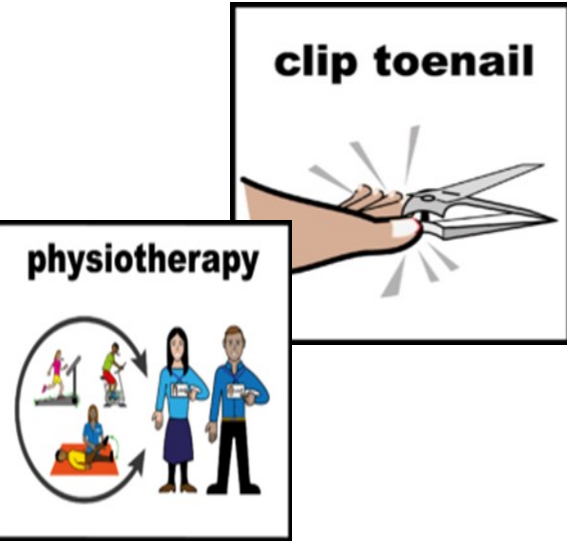

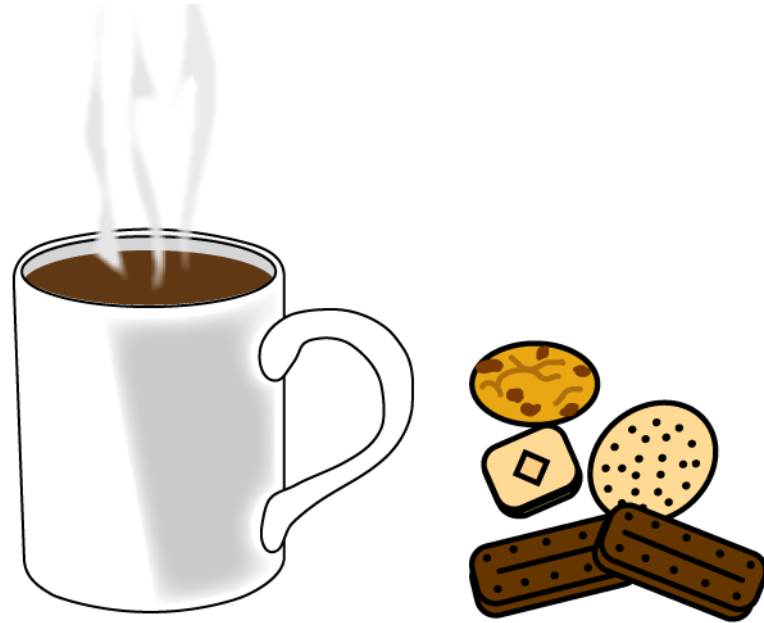

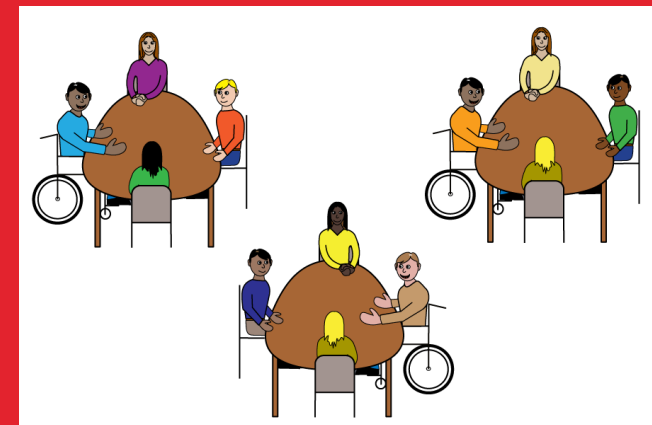

Priority 1: Heard and Valued

25/26-1A

Ensure the Council's operational Adult Social Care staff, commissioned CQC registered Providers and operational Barts and ELFT staff receive Tier 1 and, where required, Tier 2 [Oliver McGowan](#) training.

25/26-1B

Working with residents, evaluate the accessibility of the Local Offer and Well Newham platforms.

25/26-1C

The Council will develop a Learning Disabilities (and Autism) Induction Pack for Social Workers. This will include working with residents to develop videos / training to support induction.

Monitor the number of employment opportunities for resident with Learning Disabilities provided and taken up via Council's contracts. Develop with Chrystal re: apprenticeships/employment opportunities within Social Value element of construction contracts.

The Council's Community Opportunities Team to take-over responsibility of the shop at Newham Dockside to provide retail-training opportunities for people who are Care Act Eligible.

The Newham Health Team for Adults with Learning Disabilities attend all LD related ward rounds and CTR's. An ongoing, learning disabilities training programme for clinical staff is in place and plans are in progress to expand this in 2025/26.
